- The Headteacher, Clerk and experienced Governors on your governing body will provide a major source of advice.

Ms Hegarty – Headteacher Via school Parent Governors serve for a term of four years, though they can resign during that time if they wish. They are full members of the governing body and must attend at least three meetings per year. It is possible that additional meetings will be called during each term. Meetings usually last for approximately two hours. In addition, there are various committees that meet and the details can be obtained from the Clerk to governors. Due to the current situation with the Coronavirus pandemic meetings are held virtually by 'Teams'.\*

To be eligible for election, you must have parental responsibility for a registered pupil of this school when the election takes place, if you are not sure about this please contact the school office who will be able to explain this in more detail.

Self-nomination is permissible. If you wish to nominate another parent, please ensure that this is discussed with him or her beforehand as it will be necessary for him or her to complete a nomination form.

It is important that appropriate checks are made on anybody who will be working in a school or further education institution to prevent unsuitable people from gaining access to children.

On application, you will be asked to provide evidence of identity and sign a declaration that you are not disqualified from holding office within current Regulations, a copy of which will be supplied to you. If you are successful in your application, the school will apply for an enhanced DBS prior to the appointment being confirmed.

\*If you are successful in your application you will need to have access to a computer, smartphone or device that is able to have Microsoft Teams downloaded to it, to enable you to attend meetings.
