



# Cultural Capital at Ravenscroft Primary School

They help our children to develop knowledge, skills, and behaviors that are valued by society and can contribute to their success in education and later in life. We ensure that all children are exposed to a wide range of experiences that will develop their cultural capital and give them an advantage in later life.

## **Cultural Capital Experiences at Ravenscroft Primary**

- Museum Trips, including Liverpool and the wider areas
- We have a close partnership with Kirkby Gallery, which displays work by local, regional and international artists.
- Annual art installation on loan from Kirkby Gallery
- A wide range of sporting opportunities/clubs for all children
- Opportunities for all children to compete and represent the school
- School Choir visits and experiences
- Visiting theatre performances and participating in school plays, helping our children to engage with literature, drama, and performance arts, enhancing their appreciation for culture and creative expression.
- Wide range of trips planned for all year groups, including visits to historical sites
- Celebrating cultural festivals, allowing our children to learn about different cultures, traditions, languages, and customs, promoting inclusivity and diversity.
- Mentoring opportunities – peer to peer and Year 6 adult mentors
